Canada and Ecuador – United by the New Airport

A group of Canadian entrepreneurs, headed by Canadian Ambassador Christian Lapointe, and the President of the Canadian Commercial Corporation (CCC) Marc Wittingham, visited President of the Republic Rafael Correa.

The main objective of this cordial meeting was to report on the progress of several Canadian projects in Ecuador, including the construction of the New Quito Airport. The presence of the CCC -that guarantees the works- was emphasized.

As part of his visit to Ecuador, Wittingham supervised the works that are being carried out in Tababela. Mayor Andrés Vallejo, Ambassador Lapointe, the CEO of Aeon Construction Group John Beck, Corpaq's CEO Diego Pachel and, Quiport's CEO Luis Eduardo Pérez accompanied Wittingham in these visits.

Ultra-resistant walls

44% of the works have been completed in the construction of the New International Quito Airport. 516 columns and almost 24 thousand square meters of slabs have been already completed.

News: 13% of the walls have been completed. The internal structure of the Airport (reinforced masonry) will resist seismic movements of up to 9° in the Richter scale.

Over 45 thousand Ecuadorians work in the building of the walls of the most modern airport in the country that will receive millions of passengers following its inauguration in October 2010. Some 70 square meters are being built every day.
